Flying to Sisimiut, Greenland

A pretty early wake up to catch our 8h30 flight to Sisimiut, where we should land around 12h55, after a short connection in Nuuk.

Don't forget that Sisimiut is 3 hours ahead of our time.

After lunch, we start preparing for our polar wilderness experience.

Our guides will explain what to expect, how and what to pack, how to prepare your daily food supply.

Get familiarized with your polar equipment.

Let's discover the town of Sisimiut, a fast-developing and yet charming Inuit village.

In the evening, after dinner, we'll have our first Fireside Chat of the adventure.



10.Mar – Set your campsite on the Arctic Circle

Start of your Polar Wilderness Experience

After breakfast, once we are all ready, we'll head out on the Arctic Circle, to get to our secluded campsite, where we'll setup our own tents and prepare our own meals for the coming 2 nights. A beautiful setting located about 20 kms away from Sisimiut.

Let's put our teamwork to practice as we stretch our boundaries and perceived comfort zone.

An afternoon hike through pristine snow-covered landscapes, challenging ourselves with a snowshoe excursion.

As darkness falls, we gather around the campfire, sharing stories and awaiting the celestial dance of the aurora borealis.



11.Mar – Polar Experience to
the fullest

Out on the Arctic Circle

Given its remoteness, the extremely low temperatures, and the highly changeable weather, our polar guides will plan how the day will go along.

We'll find a pleasant routine in our actions and in the distribution of the various tasks to be done out on the ice. In the morning, we take the time to get ready: the time it takes for enough snow to melt for our breakfast so that we're as rehydrated as possible. Everything we do takes much longer than usual. We wore gloves to handle our equipment. Once out of the tents, the extraordinary beauty of Greenland will mesmerize us and give us the energy to keep moving forward.

Above all, this is a human adventure that requires real team spirit.

Back to Sisimiut


As the sun begins to set, we embark on our final adventure, back to our hotel in Sisimiut.

The price for this seven days adventure costs 9.750 euros per person. This price is determined on the basis of 10 registrations. If this number is not reached, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to cancel the trip or recalculate the cost per person.

Included

- Flight from Brussels to Copenhagen and back with Scandinavian Airlines (20 kg checked-in luggage & 8 kg hand luggage included)
- Flight from Copenhagen to Sisimiut via Nuuk with Air Greenland (20 kg checked-in luggage & 8 kg hand luggage included)
- All meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner) including non-alcoholic drinks throughout the journey
Out on the ice meals and snacks are in the form of dehydrated rations
- Hotel overnight based on a single room at hotel Clarion Copenhagen Airport (8 March and 13 March)
- Hotel overnight based on a single room at hotel Sisimiut (9 March and 12 March)
- Overnight based on sharing accommodation in tents or huts on the ice and mattresses/sleeping bags (10 March and 11 March)
- Full assistance and guidance by professional polar guides
- Inspirational talks by Julie Brown, founding partner of Polar Experience
- All local transportation from snowmobiles to UTVs and sleds
- All necessary polar gear, snowshoes, Pulka and harness if needed
- Medical follow up by Ifremmont during the expedition



Practical information

A valid international passport that is still valid up to 3 months after your return.

Travel and cancellation insurance

It is advisable to subscribe a cancellation insurance before registration.
The travel agency provides travel assistance insurance during the adventure.

Payment and cancellation conditions

A first non-refundable downpayment of 50% (4.875 euros per person) is requested after acceptance of your participation to confirm your registration, to be wired to the account of our travel agency Destination Unlimited BV: BE70 0689 0342 8725 (BIC: GKCCBEBB).

A final invoice for the remaining 50% will be sent 3 months prior to departure.

If you cancel your registration prior to 9 December 2025, a cancellation fee of 50% will be charged. As of 10 December 2025, a cancellation fee of 100% will be charged.
